

HOW WE PLAY SQUASH BOWLS AT DUNSBOROUGH

1. An afternoon session is divided into three 50-minute slots
2. Pop stick draw after each slot
3. Three, 4 or 5 players to each rink, each play 3 bowls
4. A player must win the mat before scoring
5. All others on the rink try to prevent scoring
6. One Power Play per person per slot to double the score for that end
7. The top four scores after the last game play in final
8. A player can enter in one or two slots for no competition fee

THE FINAL

1. Played over 4 ends
2. The top scorer can score on the first end
3. No Power Play
4. The prize money is split if no one scores

ADVANTAGES

1. New bowlers can join in without feeling inferior
2. Top bowlers together on a rink are playing against each other. They do not dominate the field
3. Players recovering from injury or ill health can gradually gain fitness by playing only one or two slots
4. It is an ideal way for potential members to come and have a try
5. It is easy to allocate rinks as any number of players can be included. Three, four or five players can play on a rink
6. The elderly can play one slot and enjoy the social part of bowls
